Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

School has been a very exciting and busy place over the last three weeks...

Trips and Visits

Pupils across the school have been on some very interesting and enjoyable trips. Year I have enjoyed a day both at Marbury Park with Year I pupils from other local primary schools, and a lovely, albeit wet, day at Formby beach paddling in the sea, collecting shells and building sandcastles. Most year groups have visited places of worship as part of our Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural curriculum (SMSC): Year 2 visited a Synagogue in Liverpool and the World Museum; Year 3 visited the Buddhist Centre in Northwich; Year 4 visited a Hindu temple in Manchester, as well Tatton Park; and Year 5 and 6 visited a Gurdwara in Manchester on the same day they performed with the Halle Orchestra at the Bridgewater Hall. The children's visits provide a real-life context for their learning in the classroom, a better understanding of the beliefs and practices of those who follow the faith, and were of course great fun. Year 6 spent a day in Delamere Forest taking part in Forest School activities and this week have spent time at their new secondary schools. Nursery and Reception were visited in school by 'Animals Take Over' and enjoyed some workshops learning about scorpions, snakes and other unusual animals!

Sporting Events

We have had representation in around 20 different sporting events and competitions, with over 100 different pupils having the opportunity to represent the school. Girls and boys from Year I upwards have participated and competed in Cricket, Rugby, Balance Bikes, Athletics, Football, Netball, Boccia, Curling, Basketball, Crown Green Bowling, Multiskills, Tennis and Dodgeball events. The teams have received numerous 'Spirit of the Games' awards for their sportsmanship and have placed first and second in many of the tournaments. Thank you to all the families that have supported these events with transport, collections, snacks, and kit etc. and to the staff involved in organising and attending.

PTA

The PTA Summer Fair last Friday was another amazing success! It was fantastic to see people of all ages and with different links to the school community enjoying themselves and getting involved with the different activities and stalls. Our team of PTA volunteers gave an entire day of their own time in preparation on the school site, plus countless hours at home and in meetings organising the fair. Our school community is very lucky to have such a committed group of people supporting school, raising money and providing so many wonderful events for our children and families. It is estimated that, with match-funding, the Summer Fair will have raised over £3000 for school. French Day

To enhance our teaching of modern foreign languages, Tuesday was 'French Day' in key stage 2. Pupils from Weaverham High School and The Grange Senior School joined pupils and staff in Years 3 to 6 for a day of activities with a French theme, including a French Café where orders and conversations were held in French. Our children really were confident in their use of basic French phrases and demonstrated just how much progress they have made across the year. Success for Gardening Club

Congratulations to the Winnington Park Gardening Club who were first place prize winners at the Arley Hall Garden Festival on Saturday. Gardening Club have worked hard all term in their lunchtimes, growing plants and making art work, creating a garden for the competition on the theme of 'Dig Detectives'. Judges were impressed by the variety of plants, the composition of the garden and the children's involvement and knowledge of the plants. Summer Holiday Dates

Family Picnic and Early School Closure on Tuesday 23rd July 1:15pm

On the last day of the Summer term, Tuesday 23rd July, we will be holding our family picnic from 12:00pm on the school field. School will close early to all pupils at 1.15pm following the picnic. Children will return to class for their afternoon registration mark and then be available for collection in the normal way. All pupils will need collecting. Winnington Winners after school club will only be open for the morning session on this day.

Attendance and Punctuality

As we approach the end of term, please ensure children arrive at school on time, and attend every day, unless they are unwell - lessons continue until the very end of term. Holidays should not be taken during term time and will not be authorised.

Household Support Fund

The Government has extended the Household Support Fund to help support those most in need due to rising living costs, particularly those related to food and fuel. This funding covers the period I April 2024 to 30 September 2024 inclusive. Cheshire West and Chester Council continues to support pupils who receive free school meals and has approved a further allocation of £15 per FSM recipient for the summer holidays (6 weeks). The funding will be distributed during the end of the Summer term.

Additional Financial Guidance
